6. Presidents Report:

President Sean Routley reported that Phoenix is back on track! With the support of many community members, business and staff under the direction of our Board of Directors, the ski hill had a great 22-23 season.

Highlights from 2022-2023:

- Seabass Sullivan served as Area Manager for the 22-23 season bringing his varied skill set to oversee a successful year.
- Don and Sandy Colclough and Kim and Tonni Neilsen donated the purchase and upgrade of a mower. Brian Johnson donated his tractor and time to mow the hill.
- Brushing crew was overseen by Jamie Stewart and Adam Williams, which contributed to the hill being able to open early.
- Lift inspection and maintenance were completed well in advance of opening.
- Opening Day: December 23, 2022
 Closing day: March 25, 2023
 59 days open (51 days open in 2021-2022)
 2 free night skis sponsored by local businesses.
- Season Pass sales were a little down from 2021-2022 season, but lift ticket sales were up.
- Events were back! The Nancy Green Zone Race, the Phoenix Open and Spring Fling brought lots of people to the hill.
- Systems and various upgrades continue with admin support from Cathy.
- The School Program had a few hiccups but was well attended.
- The Racer Program had a successful year with new coaches including Doug Huxter, Tyler Vanmoll, Marcus Perkins and Ralli Frederick. Bill Ahrens continued to be a solid support as well as Shannon Frederick and other parent support.
- The concession had a great year with events contributing to its success. Kim as always brought her A game to Spring Fling with a Rock Star theme.
- Spring Fling was well attended and included the entertaining Dummy Downhill

Looking forward to the 2023-2024 season:

- Lift inspection has been completed except for a few items to be completed by Dec 15.
- Tractor donated by Cate Turner, driven by John Malins using Phoenix mower has mowed most of the lower part of the mountain, Bobcat and Annie.
- Brushing crew led by Jamie Stewart has made a significant different working around the mowed areas.
- The Ski Patrol building has been upgraded to fix the water problem. Thank you, Don and all the other volunteers, for assisting with this.
- Dayne Waterlow is our new manager. Dayne officially starts in his new role November 15th. He has been taking the Lift 150 and 151 courses and his level 3 first aid course in preparation for his new role.

- Annual operation funding from Regional District and City of Grand Forks has been received.
- Outdoor funding Grand from West Boundary Community Forest received you will see new picnic tables, BBQ, tents, fire put and other items.
- A successful grant application from Community Service Recovery Fund will provide a complete system upgrade including website, point of sales systems, inventory control, lesson and rental scheduling, school program scheduling, and staff scheduling among other much needed operational pieces.
- Our Event Equipment Project has seen donations from AM Ford, GF Credit Union, GF Realty, Interfor, RDKB, Rotary and StellerVista so far. Other applications are awaiting decisions. This project will provide for purchase of timing system, gates, gate panels, fencing, bibs, drills, radios, tents, heaters, etc – all of which will let us run events effectively and efficiently.
- Donation, grant and funding process continues to find funds to continue to upgrade Phoenix Ski Hill.
- Volunteers for projects and fundraising will continue to be a huge part of the success of phoenix.

7. Financial Statement Report - (Balance sheet and income statement sheets provided to those in attendance for review)

Doug Huxter reported that we had a good year! 2023 saw an 87% increase in concessions sales (an excellent rebound post-covid). Pass sales were down a little bit but the day ticket sales made up for that. Overall a revenue increase of 20%. Substantial donations and grants were received thanks to Cathy's hard work. Phoenix also received the insurance settlement of \$20 000. We have knocked down the debt of the snow cat from \$105 000 to just over \$20 000. Seabass did an excellent job in keeping our wage costs low even though minimum wage went up from the previous year. The season was finished off with \$6000 in the account, but we would like to see more of a buffer in the account in the future as there are still costs that arise in the months post ski season.

Cathy reported that she hopes to bring in funding and grants closer to the \$190 000 mark this year (we are rooting for you Cathy!). She keeps a close eye on available grants and opportunities for Phoenix, and as these funds come in they are allocated to specific projects. There are also other fundraising events that happen such as Founders Day in Greenwood, t-shirt and 50/50 sales. Cathy has been working with Maddie and Sean to organize our movie night at the GEM, and pass and t-shirt sales at the ski swap. A list of cash donations for 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 to date is attached.

8. Election of Directors

After serving two terms with the Phoenix Board of Directors, Don has handed in a letter of resignation. Don served from 2000-2013 and rejoined with us for the last two years. We thank you for all your years of service Don!

1. Call to Order

3. Adoption of Agenda

4. Approval of 2021 Annual General Meeting Minutes.

5. President Report:

Sean Routley reported that the future looks bright for Phoenix.

Season 21-22 brought challenges such as dealing with covid procedures and putting policies in place.

Previous manager James Hall has provided good groundwork for getting the hill back in shape.

Kim Nielsen will be returning as our Lodge Manager.

Cathy Astofooroff is on our team and has done a lot to upgrade our systems and organize our administrative business.

Sebastian Sullivan is our newly hired General Manager.

Accomplishments:

- New-to-us snow cat purchased by private loan on December 17, 2021.
- New rental fleet of skis and boots have been added to our rental program.
- The Ski Patrol shack has been completely restored thanks to Tom Plotnikoff and Hydraclean.
- The brushing crews worked hard to open up terrain and clean up the hill.
- The parking lot was fully resurfaced.
- The lift maintenance and full inspection was completed.
- The insurance claim was fully settled.
- Pass sales increased and went online.
- School program participation increased.
- Our donation process with the city was restored.
- Fundraising lead by Kim, Cathy and our friends of Phoenix such as beer gardens, 50/50 tickets, Founders Day lots of new community connections were made.
- Grants and fundraising are in place for 2022-2023 season; we are waiting on approval.
- Brushing crews have started for 22-23 season.

Hopes for the Future:

- Improve infrastructure
- Extend the roof on the shop for CAT parking
- Rebuild the top shack
- Want more T-boxes
- Want to reduce snowcat debt

With the rising cost of doing business we need to generate more revenue – this could mean more participation programs and creating more events to draw more people to the hill.

6. Financial Statement Report:

Cathy spoke to the Financial Statements to April 30, 2022 presented to the meeting:

- The accounting system had a complete overhaul for the 2021-22 fiscal. This has allowed us to have a more accurate statement for revenues and expenses related to the operations of the hill.
- The new online processes set up have provided a much more streamlined approach to the accounting as well.
- Accounts and taxes are being paid on time (no penalty and interest). Our vendors are happy.
- All outstanding accounts from previous years have been paid in full.
- Season pass sales, lift ticket sales, school program, lessons and rentals saw increases.
- A strong donation and grant process allowed Phoenix to pay past debts and to purchase a new rental fleet, new t-boxes, equipment and a snow cat.
- Donations these were received from individual and corporations, as well as the GoFundMe campaign in early 2021.
- The City Donation process (with charitable tax receipts) assisted with over \$45,000 in donations, some for specific projects and some for operations.
- Funding and Grants includes operating grants from Regional District, Grant In Aid from Areas C, D and E, City of Greenwood, City of Midway. Also received Grants for specific purchases (ie: rental fleet, t-boxes, ski patrol supplies)
- A quick note when funding is applied for or donations requested, it is usually for a specific item.
- Fundraising includes proceeds from our successful bottle return program, promotions such as t-shirt, sign, calendars and movie ticket sales.
- Expenses in general are increasing, although some expenses have been reduced due to updating systems such as the online platform, internet system, etc.
- The most-costly expenses are wages and insurance.
- Wages were offset slightly by the Wage Subsidies.
- Insurance, well it is the cost of doing business and a necessity.
- Expenses such as equipment purchases, lift maintenance, ski patrol supplies were incurred because donations or grants were received.

7. Board of Directors:

Adam Williams, Margo Dean, Shilo Freer, Greg Van Der Zande, Ian Mitchell will not be standing for re-election.

Phoenix, the community and all of us thank you for your efforts.

The Board has discussed and recommends the size of the Board be reduced to five members for 2022-2023 in order to create a more efficient governance board.

8. Election of Directors:

Four of the current Board Members (Sean Routley, Don Colclough, Shannon Frederick, Dean Herdman) would like to continue as board members with the addition of Bryan Pankoff.
